

Hello All,

Lent continues for a few more weeks. Palm Sunday is April 13 and we will celebrate Jesus triumphant entry to Jerusalem. The moment when Israel believed the Messiah was going to "save God's people" by overthrowing Rome. We know his true mission, to save us from sin and death by his route to, and death upon the cross.

Maundy Thursday, April 17 our worship at Grace 7:00 pm is open to all in our Parish and community. We will ponder the importance of "The Last Supper" at which Jesus tells his Disciples they are eating and drinking his body and blood in remembrance of Him, that one of them will betray him, (Judas) and that Peter, before the cock crows, will deny him three times. Prayer in the Garden of Gethsemane follows. The disciples sleep while Jesus faces what he knows will be a horrific day for him, being arrested, humiliated, beaten, and crucified. It was in this garden that nearly six hundred Roman soldiers and some "other arresting soldiers" very probably Jewish, came to arrest him and take him back into Jerusalem. This very somber service concludes with the "stripping of the Altar". We are left with no visual reminder of Jesus ministry over the previous 3 years so our focus can be on Jesus alone, literally and figuratively. We leave the service in silent reflection.

Good Friday, April 18 we will worship at Our Saviour's 5:45 pm, again open to all in our Parish and community. This year we will again visit the Passion of our Lord according to Luke, and will be looking for readers to help with the service. During this Passion play we live, through the readings, as if we are there with Jesus. Only because this was God's Plan all along can we begin to understand what Jesus had to endure that day for us.

Saturday is their Sabbath and became a day of reflection. Imagine the Disciples hiding in a locked room, thinking about Judas betraying Jesus, Peter thinking about how he truly did deny Jesus three times after saying he never would. Jesus had told them this was going to happen. Now WHAT? The hours must have dragged by from about 3:00 Friday until sunrise Sunday morning.

Sunday April 20 at our regularly scheduled services we will hear: Luke 24:1-12, But on the first day of the week, at early dawn, they came to the tomb, taking the spices that they had prepared. 2They found the stone rolled away from the tomb, 3but when they went in, they did not find the body. 4While they were perplexed about this, suddenly two men in dazzling clothes stood beside them. 5The women were terrified and bowed their faces to the ground, but the men said to them, "Why do you look for the living among the dead? He is not here, but has risen. 6Remember how he told you, while he was still in Galilee, 7that the Son of Man must be handed over to sinners, and be crucified, and on the third day rise again." 8Then they remembered his words, 9and returning from the tomb, they told all this to the eleven and to all the rest. 10Now it was Mary Magdalene, Joanna, Mary the mother of James, and the other women with them who told this to the apostles. 11But these words seemed to them an idle tale, and they did not believe them. 12But Peter got up and ran to the tomb; stooping and looking in, he saw the linen cloths by themselves; then he went home, amazed at what had happened.

Jesus was clear with his words many times over the past month or so as to what exactly was going to take place. God's plan carried out by unsuspecting human beings, allows all of the believers in Jesus as our Lord and Savior, to have all of our sins, past, present, and future, forgiven. THANKS BE TO GOD.
