

Hello and Happy Summer,

Mark 6:2 On the Sabbath he began to teach in the synagogue, and many who heard him were astounded. They said, "Where did this man get all this? What is this wisdom that has been given to him? What deeds of power are being done by his hands!"



- **2. Prayer Requests/Homebound**: Loss of Alma Center senior student killed in car/train accident, Jeannine Olson, Richard Staff for his 44 years of music leadership, Reynolds Tomter (107 years old) for his trip to France for the 80th anniversary of D Day.
- 3. Communication from Congregation: none

Communication/Action:

- 1. **Secretary's Report**: Marnie Anderson made a motion to approve minutes of May 7, 2024, with a second by Clarice Laehn. Motion carried.

b) Music & Worship:

- 1. Noisy Offering for May of \$271.45 will go to the Improvement Fund; June will go to Relay for Life; the possible use of Noisy Offering donations for discretionary funds to go toward medical and other needs, will be discussed at the next council meeting.
- 2. Music & Worship may use Praise Team funds for their expenses.

- 1. Our Saviour's will host Grace Lutheran this Thursday, June 6th.
- 2. Peace Lutheran in Pigeon is hosting a salad luncheon on June 12 th.
- 3. Mission kit lists are available in narthex.
