# The Messenger

Hello All,

Ascension of Our Lord happens this year on May 29. It does not happen on a Sunday so often we do not celebrate it. This year I have the privilege to worship at Pigeon Falls Health Care Center on Ascension Day, I consider this an honor.

Luke 24:44-53 44[Jesus said to the eleven and those with them,] "These are my words that I spoke to you while I was still with you-that everything written about me in the law of Moses, the prophets, and the psalms must be fulfilled." 45 Then he opened their minds to understand the scriptures, 46 and he said to them, "Thus it is written, that the Messiah is to suffer and to rise from the dead on the third day, 47 and that repentance and forgiveness of sins is to be proclaimed in his name to all nations, beginning from Jerusalem. 48 You are witnesses of these things. 49 And see, I am sending upon you what my Father promised; so stay here in the city until you have been clothed with power from on high." 50 Then he led them out as far as Bethany, and, lifting up his hands, he blessed them. 51 While he was blessing them, he withdrew from them and was carried up into heaven. 52 And they worshiped him, and returned to Jerusalem with great joy; 53 and they were continually in the temple blessing God.

Jesus has ascended back into Heaven and is seated at the right hand of God. He promised to send an Advocate, the Holy Spirit to be with us and in us to represent Jesus among us and fulfills that promise on the Day of Pentecost June 8. Pentecost means 50. It is a Jewish festival that is celebrated fifty days after Passover. It is also called the Feast of Weeks, and originally celebrated the wheat harvest. Jews from all over the known world would have come to Jerusalem to celebrate Pentecost and were there to witness what is described below.

Acts 2:1-4 When the day of Pentecost had come, they were all together in one place. <sub>2</sub>And suddenly from Heaven there came a sound like the rush of a violent wind, and it filled the entire house where they were sitting. <sub>3</sub>Divided tongues, as of fire, appeared among them, and a tongue rested on each of them. <sub>4</sub>All of them were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other languages, as the Spirit gave them ability.

The festival of Pentecost will be celebrated now for 23 Sundays until Christ the King Sunday November 23, 2025. Then the new church year will begin with Advent.

The Disciples, as young human beings, often did not understand what Jesus was telling them. They would ask each other what he meant but often were afraid to ask Jesus to explain further. The Holy Spirit coming to them and entering into them, explained everything to them. They were now fully prepared to go out into the world and share the Gospel with anyone who would listen. They went out into many communities near and far and preached the truth, no matter what the potential danger might be. This information about Jesus was too important to hide, to keep to themselves, and the desire burned within them to "plant seeds" of a new "Way". The Way was the beginning of Christianity and many Jews and Gentiles began to worship Jesus as their Lord and Savior. God became the most important part of their lives. So much so that many lost their lives because of their beliefs. Many of the Jewish leaders felt that by eliminating many of the new converts to this Way, belief in Jesus would fade away. Fortunately for us, God, Jesus, and the Holy Spirit are alive within us, Halleluiah!
