Hello All,

Alleluia! Christ is risen, Christ is risen indeed. Alleluia!

The entire month of May is a part of Easter which officially ends with Pentecost on June 8, though one would presume that May 29 which is Ascension of Our Lord would end the season of Easter. With Jesus no longer on earth, it seems like it should be done. I suspect that since Ascension does not happen on a Sunday, we carry Easter over to the Sunday following the Ascension because it is 50 days after Easter. June 1 is the 7 th Sunday of Easter. June 8 is Pentecost the day the Holy Spirit came to the Disciples with "tongues as of fire", and they began to speak in tongues. I will comment more on that next month.

This past Sunday we learned the story about Jesus making an appearance to his disciples in the locked upper room to prove to them he truly has been raised from the dead. Thomas was not there for that visit so he was not willing to believe Jesus is alive again. This is truly a human response to something as amazing as resurrection! Since the disciples all fled from the Garden of Gethsemane when Jesus was arrested and Peter denied he even knew Jesus, they were not present at the crucifixion. Others who were actually there had told them Jesus was dead, so that is what they were expecting on Easter Sunday. Even the truth about Jesus not being in the tomb and angels telling the visitors to the tombthat he was not there, that he had risen and was alive, was not believed by any of the disciples until Jesus appeared to them in person.

Thomas gets a nickname from this Gospel, "Doubting Thomas". I see this as unfair to him, I think he is "Human Thomas". The rest of the disciples all doubted the reports from their peers but they do not have any label for doing so. When Jesus comes back and shows Thomas his hands, feet, and side, Thomas then believes. He is the only one to declare Jesus, "My Lord and my God!" You and I are lumped into the group who are, "Blessed are those who have not seen and yet have come to believe." (John 20:28-29)

The third Sunday of Easter, Jesus comes again to the Disciples at the Sea of Tiberias (also called Galilee) where they fished all night and caught nothing. Jesus told them where the fish were and they filled the net. They did not recognize him at first but when they did, Peter jumped in and swam to Jesus. Jesus gave them breakfast of bread and fish, then gave Peter the opportunity to make amends for denying Jesus three times. Jesus asks Peter three times if he loved him.

The fourth Sunday of Easter we learn about Jesus being rejected by some of the Jewish community because they cannot believe He is who He is, God's son. To them it is blasphemy and punishable by stoning. He explains to them using the Mosaic Law to support His truth but they fail to arrest Him.

The fifth Sunday of Easter Jesus gives his Disciples a New Commandment. John 13:34-35; 34"I give you a new commandment, that you love one another. Just as I have loved you, you also should love one another. 35By this everyone will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another."

The sixth Sunday of Easter Jesus tells his Disciples that the Advocate or Holy Spirit or Spirit of Truth, will come to them after he has ascended to Heaven. They will hear the word of God through the Spirit.

Stay tuned for the Ascension Acts 1:1-11.


