Hello All, Blessed All Saints Sunday and beyond,

I debated greeting you on the line above with, Happy All Saints Sunday, which most often is not a

"Happy" occasion. It is a time to remember and reflect on and about all the family, friends, neighbors, congregation members, in fact all who have left their earthly human body and now have their soul in Heaven with God. We mostly honor those who died within this year. Each congregation has it's own way to honor those souls, and in some cases, we honor the Saints we dearly miss, no matter when they left us.

November also has two other very important celebrations, Christ the King Sunday this year November 24th, and Thanksgiving Day November 28th.

Christ the King Sunday celebrates the moment Jesus explains to Pilate that His Kingdom is not of this world. John 18:33-37 (the Gospel for Christ the King Sunday) 33Then Pilate entered the headquarters again, summoned Jesus, and asked him, "Are you King of the Jews?" 34Jesus answered, "Do you ask this on your own, or did others tell you about me?" 35Pilate replied, "I am not a Jew, am I? Your own nation and the chief priests have handed you over to me. What have you done?" 36Jesus answered, "My Kingdom is not from this world. If my kingdom were from this world, my followers would be fighting to keep me from being handed over to the Jews. But as it is, my kingdom is not from here." 37Pilate asked him, "So you are a king?" Jesus answered, "You say that I am a king. For this I was born, and for this I came into the world, to testify to the truth. Everyone who belongs to the truth listens to my voice."

The very next verse, which is not a part of the reading for the 24 th, Pilate asks Jesus, "What is truth?" There is no answer offered by Jesus after that question so we are tasked with the question and answer. I have not yet studied this in detail, however, given the context of "everyone who belongs to the truth listens to my voice", God is truth and we all belong to God. Because we believe in Jesus as God, we listen to his voice through the scriptures. (Come to worship on the 24 th and I will let you know if I am on track or not).

Thanksgiving worship will be at Grace Lutheran of Pleasantville on Tuesday November 26, 2024 at 6:00 pm. Only one joint service for both congregations that evening. We feel that many of you may be traveling for Thanksgiving or preparing a meal on Wednesday so Tuesday seems a better option. This past year has not been easy for many people in the country and world. At times our hearts are heavy, our minds are clouded with stress coming at us from many different experiences. It is necessary to take some time to reflect on the positives in our daily lives that we are thankful for, including our "Holy Moments".

I would like to offer an opportunity to write down some things you are thankful for as you enter the sanctuary at Grace Lutheran, and then read them during the service so we can all experience them. This would be anonymous and you won't have to identify who wrote the petition unless you want others to know. I truly hope and pray your lives only get more positive as we approach Thanksgiving.
