

Hello everyone,

What is the Church? In a commentary by Mary Fairchild, she states; "The word 'Church' is mentioned more than 100 times in the New Testament. It is translated from the Greek term *ekklesia* which is formed from two Greek words meaning 'an assembly' and 'to call out' or 'the called out ones'. The New Testament church is a body of believers that has been called out from the world by God to live as His people under the authority of Jesus Christ. This group of believers or 'the body of Christ' began in Acts 2 on the Day of Pentecost through the work of the Holy Spirit and will continue to be formed until the day of the rapture of the church.

A person becomes a member of the church simply by exercising faith in Jesus Christ as Lord and Savior.

Go into the Church (our community) and love your neighbor as you love yourself.

God's People Are the Church: The founder of the home church movement in England, Canon Ernest Southcott, defined the church best: 'The holiest moment of the church service is the moment when God's people – strengthened by preaching and sacrament – go out of the church door into the world to be the church. We don't go to church; we are the church.'

The Purpose of the Church: The purpose of the church is three-fold. The church comes together (assembles) for the purpose of bringing each member into spiritual maturity (Ephesians 4:13). The church reaches out (scatters) to spread the love of Christ and the gospel message to unbelievers in the world (Matthew 28:18-20). This is the Great Commission, to go out into the world and make disciples. So, the purpose of the church is to minister to believers and unbelievers.

The church, both in the universal and local sense, is important because it is the primary vehicle through which God carries out his purposes on earth. The church is the body of Christ – his heart, his mouth, his hands, and feet – reaching out to the world: *Now you are the body of Christ, and each one of you is a part of it. (1 Corinthians 12:27, NIV)* 

The supreme purpose of the church is to love and worship God through Jesus Christ and make him known throughout the world."

I thought you may like to hear from an expert for a change and this seemed to be an informative article that helps us to understand that we don't just go to church, we are the church.

We are also citizens of the world. Daily we hear of horrible things happening to people all over our world. I often find tears in my eyes and a heavy pressure on my heart as I listen to the facts of what men, women, and especially children are going through to just try to live. In many cases, no food, very little safe housing, no potable water to drink and cook with. Some of the helping agencies are doing their best to get the needed supplies to these people. At times they are kept from bringing the aid to the needy families. I pray often, have donated to ELCA World Relief and World Hunger, but it doesn't seem like enough. I believe many of you have done the same, thank you for your love toward our neighbors. I keep sending my prayers to God, asking for strength, support, love, hope and deeper understanding. I realize He has a plan and that He is in charge. This keeps me more positive in my daily outlook than I can muster on my own. Please keep praying, it is important to our mental health.
