Hello Everyone,

Please join me in praying for our children going back to school. They should not have to worry about their safety in any setting, however, we know that bad things can happen. Let us pray that all their days are free from any type of harm, mental or physical, as they travel to, participate in, and travel home from school each day. May there be total respect from everyone and toward everyone from students, parents, teachers, administration, coaches, school staff, and bus drivers.

Jesus told a lawyer and consequently all of us, that our most important Commandment is Matthew 22:37-40. 37He said to him, "You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your mind.' 38This is the greatest and the first commandment. 39And a second is like it: 'You shall love your neighbor as yourself.' It would be very difficult to harm someone if you truly love them as you love yourself".

We will continue to follow along with Jesus and his disciples as he continues his journey to the cross. We will learn that the cost of discipleship in Luke 14:25-33 is a lot! Jesus tells those around him that they must give up everything to follow him. They must think hard and long about what it will mean to be true followers of Jesus. They will have to give up family, friends, neighbors, and their current lives, to be able to give of themselves to God. We will have to really ponder what all this means for our current lives with Jesus. Come see if I figured it out, with a lot of help!

The second Sunday in September happens to fall on Holy Cross Day the 14 th, which is not a big Lutheran Church Holiday but the Gospel is John 3:13-17. I mention verse 16 every time we have communion so we will get to talk even more in depth that Sunday. Or there is a totally different option of Luke 15:1- 10, Parables of the lost sheep and lost coin. I am thinking you may hear a bit of all of the above, "more bang for your buck".

The third Sunday we will learn about the Parable of the Dishonest Manager Luke 16:1-13. The long and short of this Parable is that we "cannot serve God and wealth". If we put all of our thought processes and our physical energy into accumulating wealth, we have nothing left for God. We do need some financial cushion in order to live here on earth, however, our treasure should be in heaven because that is where we hope/plan to spend eternity.

The final Sunday we will continue to talk about wealth and how it affects our potential in heaven when we hear the story about The Rich Man and Lazarus, Luke 16:19-31. This Lazarus is not the same man who was a friend of Jesus and was raised from the dead. This Lazarus was a very poor man in both wealth and health. He sat/laid at the gate of the rich man and would long for scraps from the table of the rich man who didn't pay much attention to his "neighbor" until he died and went to Hades and Lazarus went to Heaven. Then he wanted help from Lazarus. I will shorten the story a little so that you will come hear the rest during the service! We discover that someone who has wealth and no faith in God, probably will end up in Hades and not be able to work his or her way up to Heaven. Too often humans do not understand that worshiping wealth is not going to get us to eternal life with God. Although, ultimately who makes the final decision about destination into eternity? God.

Dave Anderson, council president, called the meeting to order at 6:30 p.m.

Preparation:

- 1. **Opening Devotions**: Devotions by Scott Brown
- 2. Prayer Requests/Homebound: Family of Josh Sendelbach
- 3. Communication from Congregation: The church needs a deep cleaning. Scott will check with other churches and council will research companies. Discussion will be added to the agenda for next council meeting.

Communication/Action:

1. **Secretary's Report**: Karen Witte made a motion to approve minutes of July 1, 2025, with a second by Marnie Anderson. Motion carried.

2. **Treasurer's Report**: Fund balances as of July 31, 2025, were presented as follows:

General Fund: \$98,841.56 **On Going Fund**: \$9,969.98 **Improvement Fund**: \$83,262.01

Ellen Hauser made a motion to approve the fund balances as presented with a second by Marnie Anderson.

Motion carried.

3. Ministry Teams Updates:

- a) Music & Worship:
 - 1. Noisy Offering of \$225.60 for July went to Tri County Ambulance. August will go to Improvement Fund and September will go to help with the shipping costs for mission kits.
 - 2. The Beef & Dairy Days Community Service is on August 17th.
- b) WELCA: Meeting will be held at Grace Lutheran on August 7th.

Sharing from Scott Brown (SAM):

- 1. Parish board meeting is scheduled for August 21st.
- 2. Scott will be in Rhinelander August 22nd and 23 rd. He will be leaving after service on August 24 th for a fall ministry retreat and return on August 26th .
- 3. SAM zoom meeting discussed the CasTLE Project which supports rural and small congregations and provides grants to pay for lay school.
- 4. Scott will be attending a workshop on suicide prevention at UWL in September.

Celebration/Affirmation: The date of the next council meeting is September 2, 2025, at 6:30 p.m.

Business Items:

- 1. Scott will be meeting with a group of 4 congregation members to discuss combining committees and amending the constitution.
- 2. There has been some movement addressing the AC unit that is not working. Estimates received were between \$7,000 and \$8,000. Since both AC units are the same age, it may be better to consider replacing both AC units.

Karen Witte made a motion to adjourn with a second by Kris Dubiel. Motion carried.

The meeting closed with the Lord's Prayer.
